Anuprati choice upgradation

Steps

- 1. Login Using SSO ID
- 2. Click on Anuprati Portal to enter the system.
- 3. choose Login Type: Student. Your student dashboard will open.

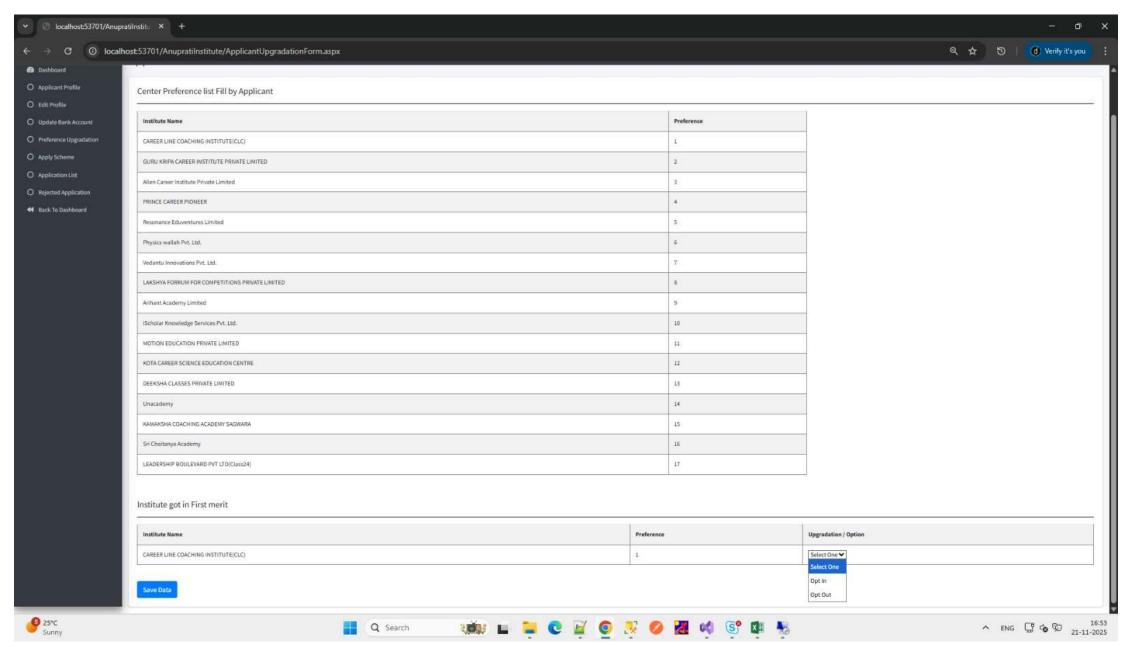
Preference Upgradation Option

- 1. On the left-side menu, click on **Preference Upgradation**.
- 2. A new page will open.
- 3. Your previously filled preference list will be displayed.
- 4. The institute allotted in the **1st Merit List** will also be shown.

Possible Cases After Allotment

 After reaching the Preference Upgradation page, two different scenarios can occur based on which preference you received in the 1st merit list.

- Case 1: If the student received their 1st Preference in the 1st Merit List
- In this case, the student has already been allotted the **top-most preferred institute**.



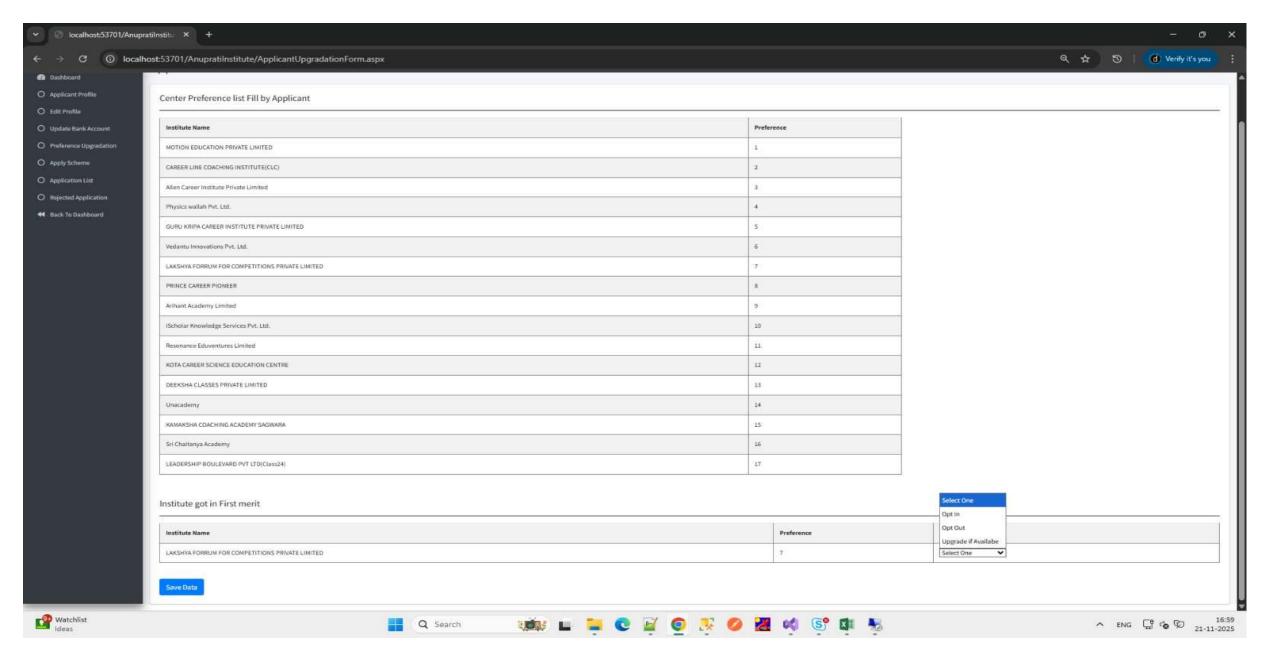
a) Opt In — (Join the allotted 1st preference institute)	b) Opt Out — (Do not join and exit from the scheme)
This means the student accepts the allotted institute.	The student rejects the allotted seat .
There is no possibility of upgradation , because the student has already received the highest choice.	No further chances and no benefits under the scheme will be given.
	Choose this only when the student does not want to participate anymore

Note: If the student does not select any option, the system will automatically consider Opt In as the default selection.

Case 2: If the student received any preference other than 1st Preference in the 1st Merit List

• In this case, the student has been allotted an institute that is **lower** than their top preference, so more choices are possible.

• The system will show **3 options**:



a) Opt In — (Join the currently allotted institute)	b) Opt Out — (Do not join and exit from the scheme)	c) Upgrade If Available — (Consider for higher choices)
The student agrees to join the allotted institute.	The student chooses not to join any institute.	Student wants to try for a better/higher preference option.
No further upgradation will be attempted.	Choose only if the student is not interested in the scheme at all.	 The system will check if seats are available in a higher preferred institute. If vacancy exists → Student will be upgraded to higher preference. If vacancy does NOT exist → Previously allotted institute remains final. Recommended when the student is satisfied with the allotted institute but prefers a higher-choice option if possible.

Note: If no option is selected, the system will automatically treat it as **Opt In**.
